Since our opening in 2017 it has been Cardiff Wests' mission to work closely with businesses in order to inspire our young people and to make employability a 'reality' to all. This year in particular we have built on successful initiatives we have had in place and Mrs Richards has been working with Careers Wales and the Cardiff Commitment team at Cardiff Local Authority to develop a business forum; the aim of the business forum is to bring businesses into the school to work with our young people offering them a helping hand to become

Part of this work gave opportunities to year 10 recently to take part in Careers Week. This involved a week of careers focused activities from 27th June to 5th July. During this week our year 10's took part in a Careers Carousel day which saw 8 different companies come and offer 'taster' sessions to all of our year 10 cohort. This was a great success and opened up a number of doors to our pupils that they had not even considered before. Employers included Cardiff and the Vale UHB, LCB,


British Transport Police, Admiral, Centregreat, Royal Navy and Rubicon Dance.

Pupil Development Grant Access 2022

Learners currently eligible for free school meals can apply for the grant of £125 per learner, and £200 for those entering year 7, recognising the increased costs associated with starting secondary school. All school years are now eligible.

Families who are eligible for free school meals can submit a claim if they have a child in:

- Primary school from reception to year 6
- Secondary school from year 7 to year 11

All looked after children qualify for the grant, whether they receive free school meals or not. Families are only entitled to claim once per child, per school year.

Funding for the 2021 to 2022 scheme will close on 30th June 2022. The 2022 to 2023 scheme will open in the Summer of 2022.

CAVE Aero Engineering Challenge



12 year 10 engineering students competed in the CAVC Aero Engineering Challenge at Cardiff airport on Monday.



The overall aim of the day was to showcase the career pathway available if they wish, once they have successfully completed their level 2 in engineering at Cardiff West.



The students were split into 2 groups of 6 to complete 5 activities based around aero engineering. These included programming a drone to fly around a circuit in the main hanger, landing a plane at Cardiff Airport on a flight simulator, jacking a plane off the ground for maintenance and building parachutes to drop eggs without breaking.



Both teams performed excellently across all challenges and mixed well with students from other schools. A number of our students expressed a keen interest during the day to pursue a course post 16.

Students from 8T entered the RAengineering Welsh Marble Challenge and from a total off 44 entries won the top Engineers Choice prize winning a 3D printer for the DT department along side a programmable robot. The pupils chose to base the design around 'green energy' and included a wind farm, biomass power station and a hydro-electric power plant. Students, as part of STEM learning, learnt all about structures and Smart materials.

This was a follow up to the geophysical survey visit that some Year 7 students supported in March of this year. The students were able to get an amazing hands-on experience of a real-life archaeological dig and supported the Caer Heritage team in finding and preserving



historical artefacts from the past of Caerau and Ely. Some amazing artefacts were found at the site of the dig,

including a Roman coin and a piece of pottery from the Bronze Age that is over 3000 years old. Talk about history on your doorstep!

We would like to thank the Caer Heritage group, especially Dave, Ollie and Charlotte for providing our pupils with a truly unique opportunity. The students' behaviour, attitude and focus were once again first class, and the Humanities Faculty would like to thank each

and every one of them for representing the school in such a fantastic manner.

There has been an amazing effort from year 10 over the last few weeks of term.




They have been using science to make perfume, aftershave and 'take home' bathbombs!
